I am delighted to continue having a front-row seat in a ministry where our leadership team, donors, and strategic partners are actively advancing God’s kingdom.

More than ever before, our world needs hope. In Haiti, it is a time of deep concern and vigilance. A long political battle, economic instability, and brutal gang violence have forced many families to leave their homes and neighborhoods. However, the supernatural power of the Gospel and a committed team of people continue to move Haiti Teen Challenge (HTC) forward and multiply its impact.

After attending graduation, Sony Lamarre Joseph, a well-known writer and radio personality, addressed our core value of making disciples: “Kudos to Haiti Teen Challenge for existing for those whom society has rejected. Thank you, Dr. Volcy, for your passion to work with the rejected and dangerous youths to transform them into disciples of Christ and agents of development.”

In the past year, we joined forces with other grassroots ministries to create a coalition of prayer warriors. In partnership with Rendez-Vous Christ Church (RVC), we reached the nation weekly with the Gospel through radio and news broadcasts, live streams, and in-person services. Our HTC and RVC teams provided training and resources to sixty Haitian churches to help meet their ministry demands. In addition, HTC and RVC served as a hub for the distribution of 20,000 Creole Bibles to approximately 20 organizations and 3,200 individuals.

On behalf of our entire ministry team, I extend my sincere gratitude for your partnership and financial support. As you review this annual report, know that you are a significant part of making all this possible.

RESTORING

From Brokenness to Wholeness

My childhood was marked by abandonment, abuse, and bullying. At age 7, I was raped by a family friend who threatened to kill me if I ever told anyone what happened. I hoped finding my real father would fill a gap in my life, but instead, I was raped a second time. My childhood was robbed from me and I felt like my life was over.

I was depressed, hopeless, and ashamed, yet I hid my tears behind fake smiles and no one knew what was really going on inside. My life choices reflected the brokenness I felt. In my neighborhood I was given many names: useless, reject, needy, shameless, homeless, dirty, ugly, lesbian, whore, etc... I was continually rejected by my peers, my family, and my neighbors. I couldn't face the stares because these words defined who I was.

Depression took over, and I retracted into a cocoon, not wanting to be around anyone. I neglected taking care of myself and engaged in cutting and starving myself. I felt I wasn't worth anything good.

It was at this time—my lowest point—that I considered suicide. The next day God intervened, and I received a call from a former student who begged me to come to HTC.

On registration day, my mom stood in front of the interviewing staff and the other applicants and said, **“My daughter is a wrecked car, but I know HTC is a garage. If anyone can repair her, it's you.”**

God used HTC to shield me from the world I knew and to transform me into the person I am today. It wasn't long before I renewed my commitment to God and was baptized.

God made it clear to me that I am full of potential, and I can use my knowledge, wisdom, and talents to transform and impact my family and community.

God not only repaired my mother's wrecked car, but He changed me completely, and I am brand new: Restored! My name is no longer defined by society; it is no longer my past that defines me. My name, my REAL name, is the one I now answer to: “Chosen by God,” written in the palm of the Hands of the Almighty.

The YTC will equip this and future generations with the tools needed to become godly leaders of integrity and prepare them to take on the challenges of rebuilding their nation.

- **Growing Spiritually:** Instructional programs and activities focused on biblical studies and discipleship for HTC graduates; expanding RVC Sunday morning ministry capacity, including RVC's children and middle school programs
- **Shaping HTC Leaders:** Leadership and life skills training, computer and English skills, job prep assistance, ongoing mentoring, and housing for graduates who are pursuing ministry
- **Fostering Community:** Café space for gathering and socializing, conference rooms for club meetings, multipurpose spaces for weddings and conferences, rooftop court for athletic competitions

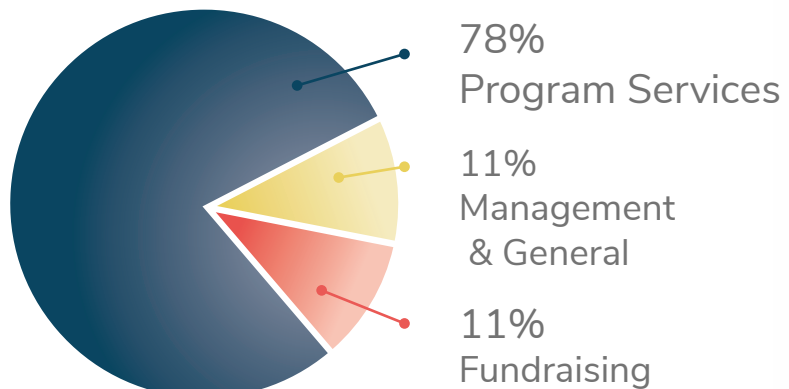


RADIO STATION LOCATIONS:
